**We assist** a wide variety of organizations that benefit from the time and talents of our dedicated volunteers.


**We believe** that active participation in craft can transform individual lives and communities through shared accomplishments.

### **Programs**

#### Numbers in Parenthesis indicate which locations offer this program

- Making Handmade Items Volunteers use our Charity Kits, or their own supplies, to make handmade items which are delivered to local charities and organizations. (All locations)
- Making Charity Kits Volunteers come to a Sewing Studio to cut fabric and assemble Charity Kits or other projects. (2, 4, 8)
- Charity Sewing Days Volunteers gather at various locations to make handmade items and enjoy the company of other creative people. (1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9)
- Accept In-Kind Donations We accept donations of sewing supplies, fabric, yarn, and sewing machines, upcycling, repurposing or reselling these items, keeping them out of a landfill (All locations)
- Fabric Stash Store We sell some of the donated supplies at bargain prices, providing sewing supplies at affordable prices and providing a revenue stream to help cover our operating expenses (2, 4, 8)
- **Mending Dignity Ministry** Volunteers offer free mending services of clothes and belongings for low income and unhoused people. (2, 3, 4)
- Finish Quilt Tops Volunteers turn donated quilt tops into beautiful finished quilts that will be cherished by those who receive them. (1, 2, 4)
- Sewing and Crochet Open Studio These free open studio sessions are a time for people to use our space and sewing machines to work on their creative projects while engaging with our creative community. (2, 3, 4, 8)
- Classes offered at Local Libraries and Community Centers Our talented and experienced teachers offer a variety of classes through libraries and community centers at affordable prices. (4, 7, 8)
- Classes offered in our Sewing Studios Our talented and experienced teachers offer a variety
  of classes in our Sewing Studios at affordable prices. (2, 4, 8)
- Creators Club A community of service-minded, creative people who volunteer their time at home or in person to make handmade items, sort donations, make charity kits, attend community events, and more. (All locations)
- Community Events and Presentations Volunteers attend Community Events and Group Meetings to share information about what we do and to teach new sewing skills to those that stop by our table or booth. (1, 4, 8)
- Community Collaboration We can design group service projects or special events for your group. (2, 4, 8)
- Sewing Machine Repair and Sales We offer sewing machine cleaning and repair services at affordable prices, and sell donated sewing machines that have been cleaned and tested. (2)
- Progress Pride Quilt Kits Volunteers cut fabric and assemble Progress Pride Quilt Kits so
  these kits can be available for purchase at an affordable price. (2)
- Hooks and Books: Stitching and Book Club Participants bring their stitching projects to work on while discussing that month's assigned book. (4, 7)
