Rag Flannel Quilt using a Layer Cake or Jelly Roll

Supplies Needed:

Layer Cake:

70 - 10" squares: (48"x68", arrange blocks in 5 rows of 7 blocks)

or 84 - 10" squares: (56"x66", arrange blocks in 6 rows of 7 blocks)

You can cut the 10" squares into 5" squares for a different design.

Jelly Roll:

50 - 2.5" strips (42" x 50")

You can use different width strips and add enough for the desired length



Optional: Batting or middle layer of flannel

Note: When cutting the flannel, keep the fabric folded, then you will have your squares/strips double sided and ready to sew.

1. Place two flannel squares/strips together, wrong sides together. These are your blocks.
2. If you are using batting or a middle layer of flannel, add that layer between the two flannel squares/strips.
3. You can sew a pattern across the squares to keep them aligned when assembling the blocks. This is optional.
4. Lay out the blocks in the desired pattern or assemble them randomly.
5. Sew one block to the next block with the seams facing the top of the quilt. Use a ½" seam width.
6. Once the quilt is assembled, sew a ½" stitch around the outside of the quilt.
7. Use sharp pointed scissors to snip the edges of the seams, being careful not to snip the stitches holding the blocks together. If you accidentally snip a stitch just sew the hole closed.
8. Wash the quilt to fray the seam edges. Clean the lint filter afterward.
